Stay informed by signing up for local alerts and have a local weather radio on hand.

Engaging with your community can also enhance your readiness. Sharing resources and strategies with neighbors can help build a resilient network, ensuring everyone is better equipped to handle whatever comes our way.

Remember, preparedness is a continuous process. Regularly update your supplies, check expiration dates, and adjust your plan to address any changes in your circumstances. By staying proactive, we can all contribute to a safer, more prepared Franklin County.

Home Fire Preparedness



Although we reside in a coastal community where we often prepare for hurricanes, it may surprise you to learn that home fires are the most common disaster in our country. However, having functional smoke alarms can reduce the risk of fatalities by 50%, as every moment is crucial

during a home fire. The American Red Cross is dedicated to preventing home fires and ensuring our safety. Volunteers and partners will install free smoke alarms and offer personalized home fire safety education to individuals and families interested in learning about fire prevention, the significance of smoke alarms and fire extinguishers, and how to create a home fire escape plan.

By installing an adequate number of smoke alarms in your home, you can enhance your preparedness. Remember to test them monthly and replace the batteries at least once a year. Be sure to educate children on the sound of smoke alarms and the actions to take when they hear one. Make sure that you discuss two separate escape routes from each room and that everyone knows the designated family meeting spot outside, create this plan and practice so that each person knows where to go. Another great way to be prepared is to create a family emergency communication plan, by doing this you make sure that if anyone were to become separated they know who to contact for reunification. Ensure everyone knows how to dial 9-1-1 for emergencies. Teach household members to STOP, DROP, and ROLL if their clothing catches fire.
